### MAIN FEATURES

The leading features of Citizen Chronograph include the following:

a) Compact streamlined design, reliable automatic mechanism It is a slim and compact automatic wristwatch with a built-in chronograph and a day-date mechanism. A watch with a universal appeal.



- b) Convenient, easy-to-handle chronograph mechanism

  Its second hand and minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand) can be started, stopped or reset at any time, and in a number of different combinations to permit wide application of the watch.
- c) Continuously moving minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand)

The minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand) set in continuous motion by means of pinion, ensure absolutely reliable performance with the absence of load fluctuations.

- d) Zero-setting device equipped with a buffer system.
  The buffer system absorbs any shock that may be applied to the zero-setting button to protect the chronograph mechanism. The hands will not return to zero while the buffer system is functioning.
- Resetting to zero of second hand and minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand)

The second hand and minute - recorder hand (and hour - recorder hand) reset themselves to zero simply at a touch of a zero-setting button.

f) Streamlined mechanism for ease of overhaul The principal parts of the chronograph mechanism can be handled as a single block for the convenience of cleaning and lubrication.


### HANDLING PROCEDURES

The crown of this wristwatch can be pulled out in two steps (from position A to positions B and C in the diagram).

### I. How to set the time, date and day

### a) Winding the mainspring

Wind the mainspring or shake the watch sufficiently. If the second hand has stopped, press the starting/ stopping button.



### b) Setting the time

Pull out the crown two steps to position C, and advance the hands. If the date changes when the hands pass the 12 o'clock position, it indicates midnight, and if not, it indicates midday. Making sure of "a.m." or "p.m.", set the hands to the correct time.

### c) Setting the date

Pushing the crown lightly from C to B position, rotate it toward you (anticlockwise direction) until you get the correct date.

### d) Setting the day

With the crown still in B position, press the zero-setting button to set the day of the week.

### II. How to operate the chronograph

### a) Setting to zero

Stop the second hand and minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand) by pressing the starting/stopping button. Then push the zero-setting button to return the hands to zero.

### b) Starting


Push the starting/stopping button.

### c) Stopping

Push the starting/stopping button once again. The second hand and minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand) stop simultaneously to indicate the elapsed time.

The minute recorder comes in two types to permit application in a wide variety of sporting events.

Type A (standard) is graduated plainly in minutes. Type B is graduated in minutes with different color markings used every five minutes to enable its user to tell at a glance the elapsed time of the race and also to observe the finishing time.



### ADVANTAGES OF CHRONOGRAPH MECHANISM

### 1. Easy-to-handle chronograph block


The principal parts that compose the chronograph mechanism are arranged between the chronograph bridge and chronograph cover, permitting the mechanism to be handled as a single block. This arrangement facilitates not only disassembly and assembly operations, but also cleaning and lubrication. It also does away with complicated adjustments of numerous levers and springs.






### 2. Buffer system


It is often pointed out that with conventional chronograph watches, sudden application of pressure on the zero-setting button causes disorder in the chronograph mechanism within. However, the zero-setting button of Citizen Chronograph is equipped with an effective buffer system. When a sudden pressure is applied on the zero-setting button, this buffer system functions to absorb the shock that is being transmitted to the chronograph runner and minute-recording wheel.




- Chronograph mechanism that can be operated in a number of different ways.
- By repeating the starting and stopping operations, it is possible to add the individual elapsed time to get the accumulative elapsed time.
- b) By pressing the zero-setting button while second hand and minute-recorder hand (and hour-recorder hand) are in motion, the hands are returned to zero position. The hands start again as soon as the finger is removed from the button. This feature comes in useful when it is necessary to reset the hands to zero and start the timer in a matter of seconds as when participants of an athletic event begin the race again after a bad start.




1 Day Dial




15 Fly-back lever




